

 - General Clean-up







- On-site work performed by RIC Trade Contractors










Planner Controlled Slurp Gun Sample

Focus: how people move to, through, and around the neighborhood.




Window Graphics featuring Historic Hopkins Maps



PITTSBURGH'S FOOD JUSTICE FUND

- Applications for the Food Justice Fund (FJF) Grassroots Grants opened on March 10, 2025 and closes April 14
 - This fund supports community-driven projects that tackle food insecurity, expand food access, and build stronger local food systems. This year, \$1.5 million in funding is available, with grants of up to \$75,000 for eligible projects.



PITSBURGH FOOD POLICY COUNCIL

In 2024 Pittsburgh City Council approved \$3 million dollars for public investment in a just, equitable, and sustainable food system that supports our neighborhoods, local economy, and the environment

Tier 2: \$1.1 million awarded to Grow
Pittsburgh, the Greater Pittsburgh Regional
Food Bank, Just Harvest, and Jasmine
Nyree Homes (Grants: \$75,000 - \$500,000);
managed by the City of Pittsburgh Awarded December 2024

Grassroots: \$1.5 million to be awarded to organizations with operating budgets less than \$500,000 (Grants: \$2,000 - \$75,000); - Applications opened March 10 2025 and are due on April 14, to fund:

- Distributing free food/meals
- Supporting community gardens and nonprofit urban agriculture
- Enrolling residents in public benefits such as SNAP, WIC, Allegheny Go for half price Pittsburgh Regional Transit fares, etc.
- Operating farmers markets (indoors or outdoors)
- Offering educational programming about growing, cooking, or preserving food, nutrition, healthy living, or composting
- Increasing residents' access to composting
- Job training or youth employment in fields

WHO CAN APPLY?

- 501(c)3 non-profits or people represented by a fiscal sponsor.
- Annual budget of \$500K or less
- Serve city residents with project sites and services located within City of Pittsburgh

FISCAL SPONSOR INFORMATION

- If you or your organization are not a 501c3, a Fiscal Sponsor is required
- Limited funds available for fiscal sponsor admin fees
- New Sun Rising may be able to serve as your fiscal sponsor
- People seeking a fiscal sponsor can apply for New Sun Rising fiscal sponsorship through the FJF online application or inquire before applying by emailing <u>info@newsunrising.org</u>


